### ***Who is a good Called to Protect™ facilitator?***

No particular educational background is needed to be a ***Called to Protect™*** facilitator. Successful facilitators may be clergy, religious, employees or volunteers, but they all share a commitment to sexual abuse prevention.

All facilitators will participate in a two-day Train-the-Trainers program that will prepare them to lead a three-hour session in a parish, school, or social service organization.

Qualities of a Successful ***Called to Protect™*** Facilitator:

- Level headed when under stress
- Emotionally and psychologically stable
- Compassionate towards others
- Reasonably objective about sexual abuse
- Comfortable with discussing sexual issues
- Able to make a time commitment
- Motivated to participate in the program
